



Title: God's Answers

Memory Verse: "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened unto you." **Matthew 7:7**

This week, we will again be following a different format. After your worship time, please spend 30 minutes in prayer with your prayer partner for the following issues:

Personal: Pray that God would show you your prayers that have already been answered. Pray that God would show you what He's done in your life. Pray BIG!

Building: Pray that God would go before Miles in all his meetings this week and that we would find favor in the eyes of the men who control the buildings.

Miles: Pray that he gets rest. Pray that he is encouraged and blessed this week.

Halloween: Pray that God would reign and that the children around the world would be protected. Pray that Christians would take a stand this Halloween and take the opportunity to spread the gospel.

Calgary: Pray for anointing over the bands and over Miles' message. Pray that many souls would be won for Christ. Pray for rest and peace to fall upon the men and women who have given their lives for these crusades.

World: Pray for the innocent people in Afghanistan, that they would find Jesus. Pray for the people of the U.S., that they would also find Jesus.

Bin Laden: Pray for his salvation.

Note: With your prayer partner, go over last week's homework and share the changes you made to your personal Walk.

Now spend 40 minutes in an in-depth Bible study and discussion of the following:

1. Take a minute to think about and write down 4 examples of your personal prayers that were answered the 4 different ways. (WAIT, DONE, NO, YES) What did you learn from each of God's answers? Share this with the group, or with a prayer partner. Read John 15:16, Jeremiah 33:3, 1 Chronicles 4:10 and 2 Chronicles 7:12-14. What answer is God giving to prayer through these verses?
2. Hebrews 11:1 introduces what element to prayer? Without this, prayer is useless. What is your working definition of this term? (Remember, HOPE in the New Testament is the "expectation of good".) What was the last prayer you prayed expecting an answer? What answer did you get? What do the following verses add to this discussion?
Jeremiah 14:10-12
1 Peter 3:7
Psalm 66:18
Proverbs 15:29
Proverbs 28:9
3. Go around the room and state what you believe God's calling is on your life. If you don't know yet, state a burden that you have on your heart for a certain ministry (homeless, youth, Stephen's Ministry, etc...).

Homework: Pray that the Lord will reveal to you His answers in all the prayers you are praying.
