“Practice Makes Perfect” Mark 14:66-72

1.) Review the action plan you made last week to help you “live in the line.” How did it go? Where did you succeed? Where do you want to improve?

2.) Quickly summarize:

- What it means to deny Jesus
- The consequences of denial
- One of the main reasons we continue to deny Jesus

3.) Pastor Miles explained three categories of denial. What do these categories of denial “look like” in your life? In other words, what does denial look like in action?

Categories:

- 1) Denial of knowledge or ignorance – not understand
- 2) Denial of association with disciples
- 3) Denial of relationship with Jesus.

4.) Confessing Christ in our lives is the opposite of denying Christ. Consider these stories of Joshua (Joshua 24:14-27), Daniel (Daniel 6), Jesus anointment at Bethany (Mark 14:1-11) and Peter (Acts 2:14-41). What do these examples teach us about confessing Christ in our lives? What does “confessing Christ” look like in action?

5.) Use the rest of the time in your study to focus on preparing yourselves to give an answer to anyone. Use any common criticism of faith; we’ve given you a start on the criticism, “I’m a good person, I don’t need a Savior.” Be sure to include a personal experience, a factual experience, Biblical evidence when constructing your answer to common criticisms of faith.

Common Criticism: I’m a good person. I don’t need a Savior

Personal Example (What have you personally experienced that would refute this statement?):

Factual Experience (What do you observe or know to be true about the world that would refute this statement?):

Biblical Evidence (What does the Bible say about this statement?): Matthew 7:13; John 3:16, 17:3; Romans 3:22-23, 4:25, 6:23, 11:6; 2 Corinthians 4:4, 11:14; Titus 3:5; 1 Peter 5:8.

6.) Everyday this next week plan time for an encounter with God. God may meet with you and reveal Himself to you at any time throughout the day; but honor Him and invite Him into your life by carving out a specific time to experience Him. You may want to read one of the following Psalms and then record the thoughts God brings to your mind in a journal. Journal about:

- What you learned about God from the Psalm
- How the Psalm applies to your life or a current situation you are facing
- Promises you want to claim from the Psalm

Use any Psalm or the any of the following:

Psalm 23, 71, 91, 92, 98, 103, 145
