“The New Testament evidence for Satan’s existence is extensive. Every New Testament writer and nineteen of the books make reference to him. Christ Himself makes reference to Satan twenty-five times. The fact of Satan’s existence finds ultimate support in the veracity of Christ’s words.”¹

MEMORY VERSE

Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. (1 Peter 5:8-9, ESV)

What do you think the America public thinks about the devil?

Perspective: We don’t need to live in fear of Satan and demons because Jesus has already defeated Satan, Jesus is more powerful, and you have the Holy Spirit living within you!

STUDY QUESTIONS

Two-fold LIE

In Sunday's sermon, Pastor Miles said that Satan uses a two-fold lie to keep us from living the way God wants us to:

- "Sin has no consequence"
- "You can be like God – in total control of your life"

How has this lie impacted your life?

New Testament Descriptions of the Devil

→ Read John 8:44

How does Jesus describe the devil?

What are the implications of these character traits?

→ Read 2 Corinthians 4:4

Paul uses the title "god of this world" for Satan. What does that mean?

How do you think that Satan has shaped the culture of our nation?

Satan has a strategic campaign to lead people away from God and take them captive to do his will instead of God's (2 Tim 2:26). Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil (1 John 3:8), and to plunder his household (Mark 3:27). As his followers, we are called to walk in the victory and freedom that he gives, and then to engage in the spiritual battle and lead those in bondage to be set free!

When Satan Tempted Jesus

The Bible describes three temptations that Satan threw at Jesus. Let's look at these to discover the underlying lies and how to respond when we're tempted.

→ Read Matthew 4:1-11 – then talk through each of the temptations one at a time, answering the following:

What was the temptation?

What deceptive lie was behind the temptation?

How did Jesus' response to each overcome the lie?
